1. **COMPREHENSION**

It is unfortunate that both the young and old have fallen prey to the drug menace. Hundreds of our fellow countrymen have died in this triangle. Others continue to wither in silence. What was initially meant for medicinal purposes has been turned into a slaughterhouse. Drug and substance abuse is a puzzle that has not yet got the right answer; not even from the government's investigative bodies.

There are various psychological factors that may lead to drug abuse. These are the factors that may easily predispose one to drug abuse. A major factor is mood disorders that may be characterized by depression. Some persons turn to drug abuse when they experience depression, in a bid to escape from reality. Such people have the distorted notion that repetitive use of

certain drugs will relieve them from stressors.

Too much anxiety is another factor. When some people experience deep anticipation, they become apprehensive and insecure. This makes some turn to drugs as a remedy to the anxiety. What such people do not understand is the fact that drugs add more to this anxiety thus making one crave for more and more in a bid to get rid of the increasing anxiety.

In addition, mental disorders such as schizophrenia may lead to drug abuse. Schizophrenia is a psychotic disorder which makes a person experience distortion of reality and disturbance of

thought hence resulting in withdrawal from ordinary social contact. Such a person may turn to drug abuse to compensate for the social disconnection.

Finally, personality disorders such as low self-esteem may lead to drug abuse. A human being is a social being who expects to be treated with dignity. However, when one is made to feel inferior, or generally think themselves inferior, they are bound to have a low self-esteem. Such a person may either be easily influenced to take drugs or turn to drugs as a way of escaping from reality.

What then should we do to ensure the sound of this silent killer falls silent? Why continue to watch in silence? Why not take responsibility and actively shout a big 'no!' to this menace?

How many more people must lose themselves to this monster?
