- 3) Explain seven reasons why Jesus used parables in his teachings(7mks)
 - To teach his disciples the need to be persistent in prayer.
 - To make indirect attack on his opponents e.g Pharisees to avoid direct confrontation.
 - Challenge his listener/stimulate their imagination/think for themselves.
 - Identify those who were sincere in seeking the kingdom of god from onlookers.
 - To make his teaching interesting.

- He was a talented teacher.
- To fulfill the prophetic message.
- b) narrate the parable of the widow and the unjust judge (Luke 18:1-8)6mks
 - There was a judge who neither feared god nor regarded man.
 - There was a widow who kept on coming to the judge
 - The judge at first refused to grant the request of the widow.
 - The woman did not give up/persisted on her requested.
 - The judge was afraid of getting warn out by the widows insistence.
 - The judge finally accepted to grant the widow her request
 - Jesus said that god responds to those who pray to him in faith speedily.
 - Jesus that god would vindicate the request of those who pray to him in humility.
- c) Give seven lessons learnt from the actions of the pilate during the trial of Jesus(7mks)
 - Jesus was innocent/did not deserve death.
 - Christians should not accuse others falsely.
 - Christians should not be intimidated/influenced by others/say what is wrong.
 - Christians should do what is pleasing to god and not what pleases fellow men.
 - They should strive for fairness of the cost.
 - Should be careful in judging/accusing others.
 - Should not misuse their powers.
 - Should give examples to others/give guidance.
 - Jesus is the son of god.
- 4) Give seven instructions Paul gave to the church in Corinth on how to use the spiritual gifts(7mks)
 - Not more than two or three should speak in tongues in a meeting.
 - In case of speaking in tongues, there should be an interpreter to explain the message.
 - If there's no interpreter, then the person who has the gift of speaking in tongues should speak in privacy.
 - Only two or three prophets should speak in a meeting.
 - He advised other believers to assess what is being said.
 - If one receives revelation, he should be given a chance to speak while the others listen.
 - Prophets to speak one at a time for the purpose of instructions.
 - Everything must be done decently and in and orderly way.
 - To speak one at a time.



- b) Explain how the unity of believers is expressed in the image of the bride(rev 21:1-12,2cor 11:2)
 - The bride is referred to as a new Jerusalem who is married to Christ.
 - John saw the New Jerusalem as a bride dresses beautifully ready to meet her husband.
 - The bride-bridegroom relationship a lifelong union.
 - The destiny of the bride was foreseen by john as emerging triumphant in the end times.
 - The brides patience in the union with Christ will not be in vain/god will wipe every tear from his people's eyes, there'll be both death pain, mourning.
 - Paul describes the bride as gods own choice/a pure bride for one husband/god cannot tolerate any rival.
 - The relationship between the bride and groom is based on faithfulness/not corrupted by sin.
- c) Outline the importance of the holy spirit to Christians today (7mks)
 - Counsels Christians/advices/guides.
 - Reveals the truth about Jesus and god.
 - Gives Christians company so that they don't feel lonely.
 - Teaches Christians the spiritual re-union in the relationship between Jesus and god his father.
 - Reminds Christians the teachings of Jesus
 - The holy spirit makes Christians to be aware of their sins/convicts them of their sins
 - Empowers them to be witnessed of Jesus everywhere in the world.
 - Reveals to them what I yet to come/enables them to prophesy the truth.
 - Enables them to discern/expose the secret hearts of the sinful people.
- 5) Identify eight Christians teachings on work(8mks)
 - Work is ordained by god/command from god.
 - Human beings should work to subdue/conquer the earth.
 - Work is good/god himself worked.
 - God blesses a hard worker/work is rewarded.
 - Christians should work to acquire basic needs/necessities.
 - Christians should work to assist those who are needy/less fortunate.
 - Christians work as co-creators with god.
 - People should work to emulate Jesus who was a worker/carpenter.
 - Work became a curse/unpleasant after human being fell into sin.
 - Christians should not overwork/enslave others.
 - Those who work should get a just wage.
 - People should work faithfully/diligently.



- Work should be done in an orderly manner.
- b) State the role of professional ethics. (8mks)
 - They guide the workers on how to relate with one another.
 - They define how workers should handle/relate with the clients.
 - They help to create healthy interactions between the workers/employees and their supervisors/authority
 - They help in maintaining the standards of the service offered/goods provided in a work place.
 - They determine how one should perform his/her duties/keep up the date with the demands of the profession.
 - They help to maintain dignity of the profession/integrity of the workers.
 - They help the public/to respect the professional from undue pressures from other interested parties.
 - They help to determine the entry requirement/qualifications needed in a given profession.
- c) Explain six ways in which the church is helping to reduce the rate of unemployment (6mks)
 - The church encourages people to start income generating activities.
 - The church provides loans to the unemployed to start small scale business.
 - The church creates job opportunities through establishing church projects.
 - It teaches the youth about dignity of manual work/encourages youth to participate in agriculture/technical fields.
 - It organizes seminars for the youth /unemployment on how to utilize their potentials.
 - It condemns corrupt practices which interfere with recruitment/economic growth.
 - It encourages its members to pay taxes promptly so that the government can have the resources to employ/pay the workers.
 - It trains/sponsors the youths on vocational skills that are necessary for employment/self employment.
- 6) What was the impact of money economy on traditional African community (6mks)
 - It has led to introduction of wage labour replacing communal work
 - Rural-urban migration has destroyed the closely knit traditional way of life.
 - It has led to the creation of social classes of the rich and the poor.
 - It promoted individualism.
 - It has led to vices like bribery/corruption.
 - Dependence on money has led to social evils.
 - Dowry has been commercialized.
 - Individual ownership of land.



- b) Outline seven obstacles to effective maintenance of law, order and justice in Kenya today.(7mks)
 - Some legislators do not observe law thus serving as wrong role models.
 - There's a lot of unfairness/injustices when settling cases because of tribalism/nepotism/religious/religious affiliation/gender.
 - Intimidation/people in high office use their power to influence certain decisions regarding law breaking.
 - Economic inability makes the poor to resort lawlessness to meet their needs/unequal distribution of resources.
 - Availability of dangerous weapons/guns in the wrong hands leads to insecurity/terrorism
 - There are few resources to cater for ever growing population thus leading to overcrowding that overwhelms machinery.
 - People lack interest/do not care about others hence don't report cases of lawlessness/permissiveness/drug abuse.
 - Bribery/corruption has destroyed the credibility of the government official.
 - People have lost respect/trust for government/machinery have resigned to a life of hopelessness/fear of victimization.
 - Inadequate modern technology hampers maintenance of the law.
 - People are not conversant with the law of the country.
 - Greed for power/wealth.
- c) List down seven effects of scientific discoveries that remain a challenge to many governments today (7mks)
 - Pollution for industries.
 - Effects of pesticides and fertilizers which destroy soil.
 - Pornographic material on internet.
 - Weapons such as guns and bombs have led to insecurity.
 - The production of alcohol has led to its abuse and hence low production of work force.
