Knowledge is power. One of the best ways of acquiring knowledge is reading. The more one reads the more knowledgeable one becomes. Some people say that a person who can read has armed himself or herself with a shield against stupidity.

It is important for children to develop an interest in reading early in life. This is because reading is a lifelong activity; there simply is no end to it. Knowledge is being created every day at an incredible speed. As such, there is no point at which any one person can claim to have read all that there is to read.

Apart from reading for academic purposes as learners in school, we also read for other purposes such as self-improvement and enjoyment. We may read about how to improve our relationships with the people around us. We may also read humorous stories as a way of relaxation. It is through reading that children learn the basic things about life such as eating a balanced diet, morality and religious facts. Thus, there is a lot to be

gained from books even when we are not reading for an examination. Reading also helps us to express ourselves and

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communicate well with each other. This helps us to develop good relationships with each other.

It is often said that Kenyans do not read as much as they should. They are known to be aggressive in other fields of life such as athletics and business. But how successful would an athlete be if he or she did not bother to read about strategies that can help him or her to excel in athletics? What business person would not want to read business articles that will help him or her to market his or her goods and achieve better results? The truth is that to excel at what we are doing, we must be inquisitive so that we can learn how to improve. In short, when we read, we increase the likelihood of coming across information that will be useful to us. That information would be hidden from us completely if we did not take the first step of reading.

Everybody should be involved in promoting the development of a reading culture in our country. The challenge, therefore, not only goes to teachers but also goes to parents, leaders and other members of the society. They should ensure that children are exposed to different types of reading material. These include simple textbooks, storybooks, magazines and newspapers. Pupils also have a responsibility to take an active role in becoming good readers. They should take up every opportunity to read whatever useful material is available to them. They should also read widely and not restrict themselves to one type of reading material such as storybooks.
