

We may also read humorous stones as a way o relaxation. It is through reading that children learn the basic things about life such as eating balanced diet, morality and religious facts. Thus, there is a lot to be gained from books eve when we are not reading for an examination. Reading also helps us to express ourselves an

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communicate well with each other. This helps us to develop good relationships with each other.

It is often said that Kenyans do not read as much as they should. They are known to be aggressive in other fields of life such as athletics and business. But how successful would an athlete be if he or she did not bother to read about strategies that can help him or her to excel in athletics? What busmess person would not want to read business articles that will help him or her to market his or her goods and achieve better results? The truth is that to excel at what we are doing, we must be inquisitive so that we can learn how to improve.
