GENDER DISCRIMINATION

At a recent press conference, Meokgo Matuba, the ANC Women's League's general secretary, said, 'According to a five-year report by the Hate Crimes Working Group, the most discriminated-against group in South Africa is the lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer and inter-sex (LGBTQI)+ community. 35% of hate crimes reported comes from LGBTQI+ people. This happens despite the protection of LGBTQI+ community rights being enshrined in section 9 of the Constitution, which forbids discrimination based on sex, gender or sexual orientation.'
